A Bit of Humor

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) found over 200 dead crows on Highway 281 this past week, and there was concern that they may have died from the Coronavirus. A veterinary epidemiologist examined the remains of all the crows, and, to everyone's relief, confirmed the problem was NOT Coronavirus (COVID-19).

The cause of death was actually from vehicular impacts. However, during analysis it was noted that varying colors of paints appeared on the bird's beaks and claws. By analyzing these paint residues it was found that 98% of the crows had been killed by impact with trucks, while only 2% were killed by cars.

TxDOT then hired an Ornithological Behaviorist to determine if there was a cause for the disproportionate percentages of truck kills versus car kills.

The Ornithological Behaviorist quickly concluded that when crows eat road kill, they always have a look-out crow to warn of danger. They discovered that while all the lookout crows could shout "Cah", "Cah" not a single one could shout "Truck"!!!

Autumn Recipes Shared by Sarah and Becky

Apple Crisp

Pre heat oven to 350 degrees.

6 Apples washed, peeled & sliced

- 1 Tablespoon Sugar
- 1 Teaspoon Sugar
- 1 ½ Teaspoon Lemon Juice Combine the above ingredients in a bowl

and set aside.

- 3/4 Cup of Oatmeal
- 34 Cup of Flour
- 3/4 Cup of Brown Sugar
- ½ Cup of Softened Butter
- 1/4 Teaspoon of Salt

Combine above ingredients, pour the apples in baking dish and cover the apples with the crumb mixture. Bake for 40 minutes or until apples are soft and the top in golden.

Pumpkin Crunch Dump Cake

29 ounces canned pumpkin puree

34 cup half and half

3 eggs

1 cup brown sugar packed

2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

½ teaspoon salt

15.25 ounces yellow cake mix

½ cup pecans roughly chopped

½ cup melted butter

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease a 9 x 13 inch baking pan and set aside. Whisk together the pumpkin, half and half, eggs, brown sugar, pumpkin pie spice and salt. Pour into the greased pan

Sprinkle with the dry cake mix and top with chopped pecans. Last, drizzle melted butter over everything.

Bake at 350°F for 45-55 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean. Let cool and serve with whipped cream.

Open Enrollment Time!

It's that time of year to review your Health Insurance Plans for changes and price increases. If you are satisfied with your current plan, you do not need to do anything. If you would like to switch plans or insurance carriers, then you need to do this during Open Enrollment, which runs from October 15th to December 7th. Please see further information regarding this under Educational &Wellness Programs.

As you look for your best health coverage options, don't forget to keep an eye open for fraudsters!

Open Enrollment can quickly become an "Open Season" for scammers. Watch out for people who:

- -Claim they work with Medicare, are an "official Medicare agent" or "represent Medicare". There are no Medicare representatives and Medicare will never cold-call you.
- Say you must join a Medicare prescription plan (also known as Part D). It is voluntary to join a Medicare prescription drug plan.
- -Ask for personal information, such as your Medicare number, Social Security number and/or bank information.
- -Threaten or pressure you to enroll in their plan. You will not lose your benefits & have the entire Open Enrollment Period to make a decision.
- -Offer you gifts to enroll in their plan it's illegal.
